

**QUALIFICATIONS AND GUIDELINES
FOR THE
EVELYN K. TITUS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

Applicants must be a senior enrolled in high school and graduating in the year of application.

They must reside in Warren County to qualify for the scholarship.

Applicant's major must be in Agriculture or Family and Consumer Sciences at a college or university.

Recipients will be selected on the basis of academic achievement, financial need and extracurricular activities. The selection committee will first look to academic achievement and financial need and will give the award in each category (male and female) to the applicant who has the highest combination of academic achievement and financial need (based on the financial data submitted). If two recipients have approximately equal academic and financial need then the scholarship award will be determined based on the best record of extracurricular activities.

The scholarships shall be renewable annually for up to four consecutive years.

The recipient or immediate family of the recipient must remain residents of Warren County as long as the recipient is receiving this scholarship.

If the winner of the scholarship must defer a year of school for a reasonable request (i.e. state FFA office, to earn money for school, health issues, etc.) the second place winner will receive the scholarship for **one year of deferment only**. If the first place winner returns to school the following year, he/she will receive the scholarship for three years only. If they do not return to college after the one year, they will forfeit the scholarship.

In order to continue receiving scholarship payments, semester grades and class schedules must be submitted to the Warren-Henderson Farm Bureau office as soon as the student receives them. Failure to do so may result in loss of scholarship.
